organisation built by artists and arts groups with a
shared interest in visual, performing, and literary arts.
Our purpose is to foster, support and promote
the arts for all age groups, cultures and Indigenous
community members.

Arts New West is a small, but mighty organization and registered charity. With the equivalent of three staff members, combined with the efforts of our volunteer Board and other volunteers, we lead and collaborate on over 100 programs, workshops and events each year.
